Uniform

Please can I remind you of the uniform policy for our school, unfortunately we are beginning to see a whole host of variations of this policy including a range of jewellery, false nails and nail varnish and trainers. Our uniform is white shirt/ polo t shirt, school tie, royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan, grey/ black trousers or skirts and black shoes.

Punctuality

In addition to your half termly attendance reports, moving forward we will also be including your child's punctuality report. Unfortunately we are finding more and more families arriving after 9am which is not only disruptive for the children and teachers in class who have started lessons but doesn't help those who are late who have to enter the class late and catch up on the work taking place. School starts at 9am and it is expected that all child will be in their class before this time ready to start their lessons. Persistent absence and lateness will affect a child's achievement and progress in school. As a parent it is your legal responsibility to ensure your child receives a suitable full time education. It is your responsibility that your child attends school each day and is on time. We understand that things happen and sometimes there may be circumstances preventing you arriving in school on time but these should be rare rather than daily occurrences.

On Friday 8th March we will be attending the Denbigh Cluster Eisteddfod organised by all schools in our cluster. Children will be competing in singing, reciting and art competitions in different age groups against other Welsh learners. This is an opportunity for our children to showcase their amazing talents, to develop their Welsh language skills and to have fun with learners from our neighbouring schools. Prelims for the event will take place in school and then we will be taking a small number of competitors to Denbigh High on the 8th for the competitions. Children will be learning the poems and songs over the coming weeks, these will be shared on Seesaw.

On St David's Day, children are welcome to come to school in the colours of the Welsh flag; red, white and/ or green or wearing traditional Welsh costume.

of St. Dwynwen's Day. Have a lovely weekend!






Innovators
