

The children have looked closely at these flowers and we were lucky enough that Jane brought some in from home to show the children. All of our children have painted their own daffodils, looking closely at the flower. This also provided an opportunity to practise some Welsh language, such as the colour and the name of the flower in Welsh. Our Nursery children have learnt a new sound this week 'u' and have been busy practising their formation of this grapheme. They also created some workerful self-portraits which will be displayed in our library. All of the Discoverers have been busy working on their number work. Year I children have been looking at different methods of subtraction and our Reception children have been comparing numbers, using language such as 'greater than' and 'less than.' Our wedding plans have begun and our Year I children will form the bridal party. The rest of the Discoverers will be the wedding guests on the big day.
