Be You to Blossom

Yesterday we welcomed Angela to school from Be You to Blossom, This is an emotional well-being and mindfulness concept that has been created to support children in boosting their confidence and self-esteem whilst enhancing their social skills:

Droplet characters have been created to support this and have been developed in a creative way to provide tools and techniques to engage and support children, encouraging resilience and fostering positive social relationships.

The droplets explore common feelings, thoughts and concerns that children experience in a relatable and empathic way.

Yesterday all classes focussed on gratitude, the Discoverers made gratitude pegs and explored all things yellow; the Investigators planted sunflower seeds and talked about why sunflowers are so special and the Innovators made gratitude stones and learnt about the science behind gratitude.

We ended the day with a whole school assembly and talked about how our feelings can change but how there is always so much we can do to change our mood.

Next week we will be exploring a different droplet character.

During assembly this morning we talked about the Month of the Military. Child, why it is important and what we can do to show our support. We read the Dandelion Poem and talked about the significance of the dandelion being the official flower of the military.

With Service children in our school we feel it is very important that we celebrate the month of the military child and share their experiences with the whole school.

On Monday we are asking children to come to school wearing something purple to show their support. There is no cost for this just a request to wear purple.
