We held a PTA meeting this week and are so grateful to those parents who have offered their support. Without your support fundraising events are difficult to plan and put on


Plans are now underway for our Summer Fair, we are looking for raffle prizes so if you know any businesses who might be willing to donate a prize please let Miss Anna know.

## Bee Friendly School

This morning members of the Eco Committee shared a presentation in assembly about what we are doing as a school to ensure we are bee friendly. The girls shared the four key areas that we need to focus on which are food, fun, accommodation and freedom form pesticides. We are already doing a lot of things to help the bees and other pollinators including having a wildflower meadow; planting pollinator friendly plants and providing a range of bee homes around around grounds.

After a discussion with the Innovators they have come up with a list of actions to help us be even more bee and pollinator friendly. Over the coming weeks all classes will be working with Mrs Williams to address our actions.







#### Discoverers

Another week has flown by, with lots of lovely activities. This week has been even better that the sun has been shining. This week we have been taking our learning outdoors as much as possible. The Discoverers have enjoyed preparing the garden area, colour matching using shade cards and creating pebble art, as well as having story time in the outdoor area. Our Nursery children learnt their new sound and used water to paint on the chalk board to practise the letter formation. On Wednesday we were lucky enough to have another visit from Teddy's dad. The children had the opportunity to try on equipment, and eat some food cooked on the stove outside under an army shelter- this is all part of sharing awareness for the month of the military child. We also enjoyed our last visit from Angela, who spoke to us about kindness. The children enjoyed lots of activities linked to the pink droplet. We discussed how important this droplet is in everyday life. We will be continuing to talk about the droplets and learning about them in class. Next week we will return to our topic work, and we are hoping to get out for a walk in our local area, to look for signs and colours of Spring in the hedgerows. I hope you have a lovely weekend.



#### Investigators

The Investigators have had a wonderful week and have spent lots of it outside as part of Wales Outdoor Learning Week! On Monday, they worked with a learning partner to investigate numbers in the school environment. They looked around the playground to see how many panes of glass are in the classroom windows, how many pieces of decking have been used for the floor of the Caban Cymraeg and many other things. Following this, the children then worked together to think of their own questions for their peers to answer. Everyone enjoyed their outdoor learning session with Mrs Williams on Tuesday morning, in the afternoon, they went back outside to collect some natural materials to create a nature picture.

On Wednesday, the children were very fortunate to have the opportunity to have a talk from Teddy's dad about what life is like for a soldier in the army. They had the opportunity to try on bullet proof armour and a helmet and ate some army food. It was a brilliant experience for them! In the afternoon, we all went on a mini-beast hunt on the school field. The children worked in small groups and used a bug viewer to look closely at the mini-beasts that they had found after digging a small hole. Yesterday, Angela visited us for the last time to provide a workshop about the pink droplet which is all about kindness. The children focused on compliments and worked hard to think of compliments for each other.

#### Innovators

It has been a sunny (but chilly) week for our Outdoor learning focus, and The Innovators have enjoyed getting out in the fresh air and enjoying our beautiful surroundings. They learnt about tree identification and used information to identify some of our trees on the playing field, as well trying to measure them using a method where you turn around and look through your legs! We have also been thinking about pollinators this week and what we can do to become more pollinator friendly. This has included drawing up an action plan for eco committee to share with the school, learning about the life cycle of a peacock butterfly and creating bee hotels to hang around our school grounds to encourage pollinators to visit us. We also took our topic learning outside this week and spotted different human and physical features as we looked around our area and down to the coast from the playing field. We had a session with Miss Katie learning how to self-regulate when we feel the fight or flight response, and also learnt about kindness and respect with Angela. What a lovely week!
